I sat down to write June's newsletter with an entirely different plan in mind. I had intended to focus on the joy of summer and relaxation and taking time for God in our busy lives. That was my intention and then Wednesday, May 15th happened and my whole direction changed. It was that day the news spread that a young man in 7th grade at Emporia Middle School had passed away in a car accident, that broke my heart. It was that day as countless memories of pain and loss from my own past came flooding back like a roaring river, that I cried. It was that day as I sat with my heartbroken 13-year-old daughter while she cried and shared stories about her friend, and I couldn't fix it. It was on that day while I stood with members of our community at 12th Avenue Baptist at a Candlelight Vigil for the Garate family that I could see the pain and the anguish in so many faces. More than that I could see the confusion and the loss. I could even see the inevitable question that was sure to come up if it hadn't already. Why?

The question of "why?" isn't a new one. It was asked in the Old Testament by Job and the writers of the psalms. It has been asked throughout the centuries as we have seen wars and other atrocities happen. It's possible you've never asked why our world is infected with pain and suffering, but my guess is you will when they strike you or a loved one. And Jesus said they are coming. Jesus was honest about the inevitability of suffering. In John 16:33 he said, "You will have suffering in this world." He didn't say you might-he said it is going to happen.

But why? If you ask me, "Why did God allow this life to be taken at such a young age?" the only answer that I can honestly give consists of three words: "I don't know."

I don't have God's mind and I don't share His perspective. In

1 Corinthians 13:12 Paul writes, "For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known."

Someday we'll see clearly and we will understand, but for now things are dim. We can't understand everything from our perspective. And frankly, the people in our community who are suffering from this tragedy don't need (or want) a big theological treatise right now. Any response like that is going to seem trivial and completely inadequate. What they desperately need now is the very real and comforting presence of Jesus Christ in their lives.

Earlier in this article I quoted part of what Jesus said in John 16:33. Now let me give you the entire verse: "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."

It was through that cross that Jesus conquered the world for us. Suffering is a personal problem; it demands a personal response. And God isn't some distant, detached, and disinterested God; he entered into our world and personally experienced our pain. Jesus is there in the lowest places of our lives (Joshua 1:9, Isaiah 41:10, Deuteronomy 31:6, Zephaniah 3:17, Matthew 28:20, Hebrews 13:5, Romans 8:38-39).

God does so much more than sympathize with us in our troubles. After all, any close friend can do that. Any close friend can sit beside us and comfort us and empathize with us. No, Jesus is much closer than your closest friend. If you've put your trust in him, then he is in you. And, therefore, your sufferings are his sufferings; your sorrow is his sorrow.

So when tragedy strikes, as it will; when suffering comes, as it will; when you're wrestling with pain, as you will-Jesus Christ is with you and in his loving arms you will find: peace to deal with the present, courage to deal with your future, and the promise of eternal life in heaven.
