My dear sisters and brothers in Christ of Messiah Lutheran,

As we prepare to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord in the midst of a global COVID-19 pandemic, I find myself thinking how different that first Easter morning was, when there were no hallelujahs, no trumpets, no jubilation. There were only women who had come to anoint Jesus' body, because it had not been done before his burial.

Suddenly, there is an earthquake as an angel of the Lord came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance like lightening and his clothing white as snow. The guards froze in their tracks. But the angel told the women, "do not be afraid; I know you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. But He is not here; for He has been raised, as He said. Come see the place where He lay."

The angel then encourages the women to go and tell Jesus' disciples that Jesus has gone to Galilee and will meet them there. But note that, even had the story ended there, the fact was proclaimed that Jesus had been raised. The tomb was empty. In spite of the women's awe, death did not have the last word, Christ has Risen.

In accordance with County and state guidelines to stay at home lasting effectively through the end of April the leadership team has decided to continue with the current worship plan of 9:00am at the Lyon county Fairgrounds and 11:00 a.m. with a streaming only service until April 30<sup>th</sup>. We will continue to monitor the situation and will keep everyone advised if anything changes.

This will affect our Holy Week Worship but it will not stop it. Once again, we will show that sin, death and the devil will not prevail against our celebration of Easter. The devil has tried for over 2,000 years to stop the celebration of Easter and he isn't about to win now! We might not have the loud shouts of hallelujah; our sanctuary might be silent but we will still be celebrating Jesus in our homes with our families. There will be shouts of hallelujah ringing out around the world as we celebrate His death and resurrection. It is my prayer that you will join us we celebrate this Holy Week and Easter (a little differently than usual) but with the same boldness and excitement as we proclaim; Christ has Risen! He has Risen Indeed!



Romans 6:5 reveals the hope we have because Jesus rose from the dead on Easter.






# Puzzle!
