your healer" Exodus 15:26





# Messiah Lutheran - January 1, 1923 History Note

The following is from the Emporia Gazette printed on Friday, April 6, 1945:

## \$250,000 for Churches

Post war church new construction and remodeling and expansion work in Emporia is conservatively estimated at \$250,000. That is a tentative figure for five churches with plans well under way. These include the new First Congregational Church at Twelfth and State. \$100,000: a new Messiah Lutheran church on a new site Eleventh and Neosho. \$25,000: addition to First Christian church. \$50,000: remodeling and expanding First Presbyterian church. \$50,000: finishing construction of Frist Friends church, \$15,000.

"To redeem is to 'buy back', and this is what the human kinsman-redeemer does - he buys back his relative from slavery, or he buys back his relative's portion of the Promised Land so that it may continue in the family."
